Safe, Up-To-Date Schools For All Students

Most of the Alvord Unified Schools have not been updated with modern classrooms, athletic facilities, or career training facilities. Several of them are 70 years or older, were built at a time when asbestos and lead pipes were used during construction and need to be updated to meet today's safety and educational standards.

Updating older schools would help ensure all our students have the same educational opportunities as others in the region — preparing students who plan to go to college for future success and providing career training to those who do not plan to go to college.



Local Funding to Improve Alvord Unified Schools

To provide necessary funding to repair and upgrade local schools, the AUSD Board of Education has placed Measure J on the November 2022 ballot. Measure J would provide \$248 million in locally controlled funding to upgrade school facilities and cost approximately 6¢ per \$ 100 of assessed (not market) value annually, while bonds are outstanding.

- Improve campus safety and security systems including adding features that strengthen campus security and threat prevention/detection, such as fencing, outdoor lighting and cameras
- Replace deteriorating roofs, plumbing, outdated electrical and inefficient heating and air conditioning systems
- Provide modern classrooms and labs for career and technology education (CTE) classes, including health sciences, engineering, technology, robotics and skilled trades
- Update fire-safety systems and remove hazardous materials like asbestos and lead paint from older schools

Mandatory Fiscal Accountability

- Project list detailing exactly how the money will be used
- Citizens' Oversight Committee and independent audits are required
- All funds will support local students and cannot be taken away by the State
- Measure J funds cannot be used for administrator salaries or benefits
