The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Alvord Unified School District was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Kaspereen, in the Board Room of the District Office.

A quorum was established with the following Board Members in attendance:

<u>Hearing Session:</u> President Kaspereen extended an invitation to the audience to present matters of concern related to Closed Session items. The following individuals came forward:

- ▶ Beth Newell Ms. Newell commented about the first Board Meeting she attended years ago and how the building was dilapidated and infested. She stated that so much has changed and it is because of our leadership who believes that Alvord students can be the best, if they are given the best. Ms. Newell stated that teachers are asking you to demonstrate what you want, what is best for our students, by treating teachers with respect, acknowledging their concerns, successes and demonstrating professional behavior. Ms. Newell stated that the Board can tell the teachers how they care, with their votes.
- ➤ Oriquedia Wilcox Ms. Wilcox stated that she is here to show support for the Superintendent, union, district and students. Ms. Wilcox indicated that teachers are working before and after their contract to support students because they care. Ms. Wilcox stated that she is appreciative of all the improvements; bringing art and music back to the classrooms and elementary PE. We want to offer the best, so we can get the best. You get what you pay for.
- ➤ Susan Bain Ms. Bain thanked the Board for her recognition at the last Board Meeting and was honored to be Teacher of the Month. She stated that a better way to honor teachers is to give us the raise that the association is asking for. Ms. Bain indicated that teachers have given up over 26% or their salary over the past 17 years to pay for



- benefits. Teachers give up their lives and work well past their contracted day. Ms. Bain stated that kind words are nice, but action is everything. Please act in a manner that lets teachers know you appreciate what they do. We go above and beyond to make sure students realize their unlimited potential and a raise for teachers would help them realize our unlimited potential.
- ➤ Brianna Wilcox stated she is a third generation teacher and graduate of this district and with the help of her teachers received a full ride to Princeton. Ms. Wilcox indicated it was her loyalty to Alvord that pushed her to apply, not the pay. Ms. Wilcox expressed how teachers need to feel valued. If you want to attract the best, you have to let them know you value them.
- > Madrienne Johnson read the following statement: Abraham Lincoln reminded us of what Jesus said: A house divided against each other cannot stand alone. When I came to this district in 1992. I had to wait for a month to get paid and the teachers and parents of this district offered to help to make sure my children and I could eat. We actually had what we needed because my now husband was working for us. But with a few notable exceptions this district has felt and responded as a living family as long as I've worked here. Since Mr. Barragan has become politically interested in this district, he has showed division and district between and among people who have worked, if not perfectly, still very well together - teachers, parents, non-certificate, union and administration personnel. And now, I understand we have been threatened if we speak up against his agenda or actions. His claims about the salaries and benefits of teachers and others do not reflect the real world in which we live – the loans that young teachers now have to pay, the value our educations themselves would and do earn elsewhere in society, costs of housing in our own district; nor does Mr. Barragan appreciate the contexts of law within which we operate. Dialogue and cooperation has set Alvord apart on "the cutting edge of professional development" and has "other districts following our lead". Mr. Barragan's focus is entirely antagonistic opposition and as such has or should have no valid place in our community. We are a family and enough is enough.
- ➤ Leigh Hawkinson, President of AEA Ms. Hawkinson stated she would like the Board to take her important message back upstairs with them; show respect and value to the teachers that day in and day out are teaching students and doing the job. Ms. Hawkinson stated that teachers are not asking to be number one in pay in the surrounding districts; we just want to be competitive. Ms. Hawkinson stated she has supplied many of you with benefit information in the past. Our benefits cost less than surrounding districts and we have worked hard to maintain them. We have higher deductible and co-pays and have a plan that takes care of our families. Surrounding districts have not given up the salary we have for benefits. Ms. Hawkinson stated that when you reject a salary proposal the message you're sending is you don't think our teachers are worth any more than neighbors to the east and west. We will end up losing teachers and Alvord will be at the bottom of the barrel again. So do the right thing, show us respect and show us the money.
- ➤ Mary Ryan Ms. Ryan is upset that someone would write that she is one of Leigh's children. She is 53 years old, has raised children, has a master's degree and taught school in this district for 27 years. She is not a child. Ms. Ryan expressed her confusion

about an understanding she thought the district and association had with regards to left over money and the right to bargain. Ms. Ryan expressed how frustrating it is. Ms. Ryan would appreciate it if you would consider all we have accomplished and consider us again.

- Ralford Jones Mr. Jones shared a Chinese proverb "the most beautiful site is not a sunset hue or a mountain decked with flowers, but to watch a child walk confidently down the road after they have been shown the way". I stand here on behalf of my colleagues, to say they have been showing children to walk confidently down the road and if you want to see the children you represent walk confidently down the road in Riverside you need to do the right thing.
- ➤ Jessica Swanson Ms. Swanson thanked Leigh and Dr. Salazar for the wonderful professional development she had the opportunity to lead with Rebecca Berlin. She expressed how it was the best one she has ever been a part of. Ms. Swanson stated that there have been nine high school band directors and in the last five years only one has lasted three years, which is me. Ms. Swanson stated she loves the Board but you do not pay me enough. You get more out of me than you give. The 5% raise that the association is asking for is a small token of your appreciation. Ms. Swanson stated she heard that a Board Member asked what will be get in return for the 5%.
- Pye Cornejo Ms. Cornejo stated she has not been focused on the raise at the past meetings but after seeing the numbers and understanding them better she realizes that the money is there. Ms. Cornejo stated that the teachers would never jeopardize the solvency of our district. She stated she does not make up facts; she does research before speaking at a meeting. You do realize the truth, don't you?
- Mike Kolonics Mr. Kolonics stated that he is available to hear the Board's proposal.

The Board adjourned to Closed Session at 5:32 p.m. and reconvened to Open Session at 7:03 p.m. in the Board Room of the District Office.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was recited by those in attendance.

**Hearing Session:** President Kaspereen extended an invitation to the audience to present matters of concern related to Closed Session items. The following individuals came forward:

- ➤ Elsa Barboza, CSEA President, stated that CSEA has established a good working relationship with the district this past year and have been working to build trust, but when administrators are using retaliatory tactics against classified employees for speaking up, it's wrong, we teach our children not to bully and harass. Leadership employees should be showing by example, The district has policies against harassment so I just want to remind you to please pass on the message before we move forward to file formal paperwork. Ms. Barboza stated that CSEA was informed that the district is not in any position to add more positions because of the fiscal impact, yet on the agenda there is a full time teaching position because of increased enrollment. CSEA has not had a resolution to the proposal at the Alternative Education site which would not have a fiscal impact. Ms. Barboza asks that the Board look into this matter.
- Yedid Gonzalez Ms. Gonzalez is a Booster parent at Norte Vista, she thanked the Board for the uniforms and asked if there was any paper work that needed to be completed for a turnaround trip. Ms. Gonzalez is concerned that middle school students are not being placed in band after having band in elementary school. She is concerned that students are slipping through the cracks. Ms. Gonzalez requested a facility for a mattress fundraiser and asked what the procedures were. Ms. Gonzalez stated they still need a trailer for the marching band.
