The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Alvord Unified School District was called to order at 4:01 p.m. by President Kaspereen, in the Board Room of the District Office.

3. <u>Local Control Accountability Plan, LCAP - Progress Towards Local Control Indicators:</u> Kathleen Kennedy, Director II, State and Federal Programs reviewed actions from the 2016-2017 school year that demonstrates progress towards LCAP Local Indicators.

<u>Hearing Session:</u> President Kaspereen extended an invitation to the audience to present matters of concern related to Closed Session items.

➤ Reynalda Bodnar – Mrs. Bodnar addressed concerns regarding disrespect, negotiations, and finances. Mrs. Bodnar has heard rumors that finances are being funded to AEA from the Board out of tax payer's money. Mrs. Bodnar expressed concern over an email that was sent to her husband and the fact that her email was hacked. Mrs. Bodnar stated that the district needs to negotiate in good faith with the union.



- ➤ Ralford Jones Mr. Jones stated that he had some wonderment this week and wanted to share a statement from Albert Einstein: "No problem can be solved with the same consciousness from which it was created." Mr. Jones addressed concerns about women's professions and how they had to fight for every penny they earned. Mr. Jones wondered if Board Members in other districts ahead of us in salary are more progressive than our Board members. Mr. Jones stated that he would like to see all of us on the same team because we are here for the same reason, we love children.
- ➤ Erica Zamora Ms. Zamora commented about her work with students and how she is teaching them problem solving solutions using the acronym STEP; S-you say the problem without blame, T-you think of solutions that are safe and respectful, E-you explore the consequences of what can happen if, and P-you pick the best solution and make a plan. Ms. Zamora stated that AEA gave a solution but the district only offered a onetime 1% increase and the consequences of what could happen is staff will leave. We need to be kind and respectful, it is okay for people to get upset because we are all passionate and want to be appreciated.

The Board adjourned to Closed Session at 4:44 p.m. and reconvened to Open Session at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the District Office.

<u>Hearing Session:</u> President Kaspereen extended an invitation to the audience to present matters of concern to the Board. The following individuals came forward:

- ➤ Reynalda Bodnar Mrs. Bodnar voiced concerns regarding a record request she submitted and the fact that after doing so her email account was hacked. Mrs. Bodnar expressed her frustration about an email that was sent to her husband stating she was saying derogatory remarks about AEA. She requested that the Board hold AEA to the professional ability they need to be held too. Mrs. Bodnar stated that she does not like the disrespect shown to others while they are speaking.
- ➤ Donna Webster Mrs. Webster commented on the positive response regarding the Alvord Cares 1st Annual Walk-a-thon on November 4th. Mrs. Webster thanked those who helped with the event: Stacy Collins, Traviett Jernigan, Sheri Lazzarini, Alvord and LSU students, Ahn Nguyen and Valeica Rife for all their help with set up, organization, knowledge and school site pantries. Mrs. Webster welcomed Anthony Recendez and expressed a special thank you to Julie Koehler Mount for her contribution and idea for T-Shirts; Carolyn Wilson for listening to our vision and Julie Moreno for keeping us grounded and reminding us of the big picture; Jeff Hinshaw for setting up the payroll deduction and Nanci McGregor for her endless running of Alvord Cares. Last but not least she thanked Dr. Salazar for all of his support and always making time to meet with the committee and for coming up with the payroll deduction idea. Thank you all very much.
- ▶ Debbie Mitchell Ms. Mitchell spoke on behalf of the MENDIT Committee stating that they would like to give a huge thank you to Hillcrest High School for opening their gym for the event on Tuesday. She indicated that there was an agreement to bring them all forward but there seems to be a long drawn out process. Ms. Barboza said that it demonstrates a lack of respect to classified employees. Ms. Barboza asked that the item be pulled and brought back with the rest of the reclassifications and appeals. Ms. Barboza reminded the Board about Board Policy 4030 which states: The Board of Education desires to provide a positive work

environment for employees free of harassment and assured equal access and opportunity in accordance with the law. This has not stopped it has gotten worse. Employees have spoken up and find themselves facing disciplinary action, negative evaluations and/or placed on administrative leave. CSEA has been following the chain of command but matters are not getting resolved. Ms. Barboza would like a committee formed to get issues addressed and resolved.
