<u>Hearing Session</u>: President Kraft extended an invitation to the audience to present matters of concern to the Board. The following individuals came forward:

➤ Brian Gernertt, President of CSEA Chapter 339, expressed concerns related to negotiations and stated that he believes talks have come to a stalemate. Mr. Gernertt stated that he wanted to solve the problem related to benefits by taking money that was going towards members within the compensation and salary study and put that money towards classified benefits, which would provide some breathing room until next year. Mr. Gernertt also expressed concerns related to Self-Insured Schools of Southern California (SISC) requiring two forms of verification for members' spouses and the recent cancellations of coverage for some spouses including his.

HEARING SESSION

- Leigh Hawkinson, President of AEA, stated the problems with CSEA benefits is the same problem the Board heard about five years ago and although CSEA's leadership has changed, no one has taken care of the problem in a meaningful way. Ms. Hawkinson stated that CSEA needs to make changes and that a benefits bailout is not fair to the AEA membership who have never asked for a bailout and have had significant out-of-pocket costs and payroll deductions even during furlough days. Ms. Hawkinson stated that AEA has given up 23.5 percent in salary to pay for benefits over the last 16 years she cannot keep telling her members that money is going towards CSEA benefits when AEA members are giving up salaries for their benefits.
- Linda Buchanan, Campus Supervisor III, stated that she was recently notified that Kaiser cancelled coverage for her and her family. Ms. Buchanan requested that negotiations continue and provide a reasonable deduction for classified benefits.
- David Bluestein, Wells Middle School Teacher, distributed a flyer related to the current Board of Education elections and requested that the flyer be investigated due to the false and inflammatory information contained in the flyer.
- ➤ John Brandriff, Community Member, thanked the Board for hiring consultant Todd Dorn and for their participation in the Citrus Classic Bike Ride.
- Debbie Mitchell, Special Education Assistant, stated that she is saddened, offended and disappointed in the current political arena and did not believe that Washington politics would come to Alvord.
