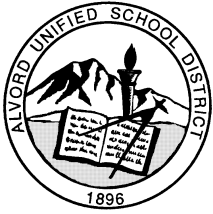

Ben Johnson ~ Mr. Johnson attended the Riverside College and Career Fair at the Tyler Galleria last night. It was well attended with over 7,000 individuals there. Mr. Johnson commended Alvord for having five tables there and stated that the event was well attended by the Alvord Leadership Team. Mr. Johnson apologized to Brian Gernertt for being placed in a difficult position with his membership. Mr. Johnson stated that Alvord received half of the funds received at last year’s Annual Riverside Citrus Classic Bike Ride and he believes Alvord needs to show that they are equally involved by making sure there are plenty of volunteers in attendance.

Greg Kraft ~ Mr. Kraft stated that the Board talks about communication all the time and they should not have to listen to complaints about the lack of communication. Mr. Kraft requested that staff provide a report on the condition of the baseball field at Norte Vista High School.

Dr. Salazar ~ Dr. Salazar participated in several events throughout the District recently including the La Sierra High School Business Academy activity.
